Nearly a year ago, three Clay Electric lineworkers were part of a group of volunteers from Florida electric cooperatives that traveled to a remote village in Guatemala, installing power lines and bringing electricity to more than 20 homes.

None of them had ever performed such a feat, and mind you, they were working without the efficiency of modern tools. The 17-day trip highlights the cooperative spirit that defines our organization.

Your trust in us drives our commitment to financial responsibility and transparency, and throughout the year, we've remained true to our cooperative values by decreasing the cost of power five times through Power Cost Adjustments, ensuring you receive power at-cost. In the face of challenges, like Major Hurricane Idalia, which left 46,000 of our members without power, our lineworkers worked tirelessly to restore service. I am proud to report that, thanks to their dedication, power was restored for nearly all of our members by the weekend after the storm. I want to once again thank you all for the outpouring of support you showed for our lineworkers, and of course, your patience during what the National Weather Service called "an unprecedented event."

Let's reflect on what it truly means to be part of the Clay Electric Cooperative - a community that cares, supports and empowers one another. I thank you for your continued trust and partnership.

New combined-cycle facility makes cleaner, more affordable energy

With eyes on a cleaner, more reliable and more affordable energy future, Seminole Electric Cooperative — Clay Electric's wholesale energy provider — recently unveiled its new state-of-the-art natural gas combined-cycle facility, which benefits both the environment and our members.

The year 2023 was an important year for Seminole Electric as it marks its 75th anniversary. It was also 45 years ago when its members helped to build Seminole's very first power plant, and during a site selection process, they chose Putnam County.

In late 2015, that relation-

ship with Putnam County was reaffirmed as it was once again chosen as the home for its new \$700 million natural gas facility, a project that took 7.5 years to complete from start to finish.

"And we had a few obstacles we had to overcome, like the first major global pandemic in more than 100 years and a global supply chain crisis," said Seminole Electric General

Manager and CEO Lisa Johnson. "But despite those things, nothing stopped this project from going forward."

The new 1,100-megawatt combined-cycle facility will make more electricity while burning less gas, which in turn saves Clay Electric members money on their electric bills. The facility alone can serve over 1.1 million homes.

"This new plant is also good for our environment and (shows) the commitment that Seminole has to this community and all of the communities we serve to be safe, responsible and sustainable," Johnson said.

Importantly, Johnson added, the facility can ramp up its electric production by a staggering 75 megawatts per minute. By comparison, the existing technology at the Seminole Generating Station in Palatka can go between 2 and 6 megawatts per minute, and the Midulla Generating Station on the

> Hardee/Polk County line can ramp to approximately 12 megawatts.

That's important as the energy grid continues to add more solar generation capacity and the potential for service interruption from cloud coverage and afternoon thunderstorms grows, challenging the balance between supply and demand.

"Quick-ramping facilities like the Seminole Combined-Cycle Facility will provide the backup and the speed to better

manage these new challenges," Johnson said.

Combined with the removal of one of Seminole Electric's coal fired units, it expects a 40 percent reduction in air emissions, a 34 percent reduction in carbon dioxide emissions and a 27 percent increase in electricity generated in Putnam County.

"The first day of the tour, I learned about service to hundreds of communities, selfless efforts to manage through the pandemic and initiatives to meet water and internet needs.

My time in Tallahassee and Washington's capitols revealed the humanity of our small-town-to-Congress representatives and lobbyists, while highlighting the immense possibilities available to me as I prepare for college.

We spoke with Congressman Neal Dunn and had several opportunities to meet high-profile military and political personnel. I especially enjoyed our visit to the Washington Monument and the World War I, II and Korean War memorials. Our visit coincided with Army Day, a holiday during which Veterans are flown out to the Memorial and interviewed by local TV stations for their personal experiences.

On Conference Night, we proudly shouted 'Florida man, that's my guy!' We met students from around the U.S., trading pins and stories. We learned of an international initiative in which co-ops collaborate to send lineworkers overseas, providing electricty to disenfranchised communities.

I now represent an amazing organization of selfless members across Florida, leaders in its offices and lineworkers who serve come rain or shine. I could not be more grateful."
