Storm season means being prepared

Hurricane preparedness may not be the most riveting topic. When there's no immediate threat, no storm headed our way it's easy to put things off.

Last fall's storms showed that it's not a good idea to not have a plan.

After more than 14 years with no major storm events, we experienced two storms in 2016 that caused widespread damage and outages affecting thousands of our members.

This year's forecast calls for an above average hurricane season, with experts suggesting that 11 named storms will form, with four hurricanes this season.

Even with that prediction, Floridians know that anything can happen during hurricane season. Now is the time to make plans, and that is why we're providing this hurricane preparedness guide. It can help you make plans and ensure your family and property are secured should a major storm head our way.

This issue of the *Kilowatt* has preparation tips and information about storms. We hope it is beneficial.

Here are some additional thoughts:

Get the whole family involved

It's essential that everyone knows early on what the plan is, and his or her role in it. Involve everyone in the family, especially children, in your preparations. Each family member should have responsibilities so work is shared and nothing is overlooked. You're all in this together.

Decide where you want to be during a hurricane

This may be the toughest decision, so make it early. Authorities recommend you prepare well and stay home if you are not in an evacuation zone. If you decide to go to a shelter, a friend's house or a hotel, don't go too far or you'll risk getting trapped on gridlocked roadways.

You can get out of town, but unless you go early, it may pose so many problems that home or a local shelter may be a better alternative.

Study all the choices and decide — now — which is best for your family. Be specific in your planning and be sure to include pets in those plans.

Tell others about your plan

Tell at least two family members who live outside your area what you're going to

do in case of a hurricane. If you're staying put, let them know and try to communicate with them afterward. If you're leaving town, tell them where you're going. If you change plans, let them know.

Decide what to do if your family gets separated

Have a designated meeting place, and a backup.

Make preparations for children

Decide now who picks them up from school during a storm threat if both parents work. Start helping them now to deal with any fears: explain what a hurricane is, what it can do, and what preparations you are making.

Prepare for those with special needs

Make arrangements right away for family members who are elderly or who have special needs. Remember, if someone depends on electrical life support, there probably won't be power after a storm. Contact your local Emergency Management Office for details.

Keep some emergency cash

A hurricane will disrupt banking schedules. ATMs and credit cards, in a world without electricity, will not work or will run out of cash. Don't charge your credit cards to the limit; you may need them to get more cash after the storm.

Buy supplies early


Planning is key to avoiding price gougers who appear after calamity strikes. Buy as many supplies as you can, especially big-ticket items like generators, before a hurricane threatens and demand skyrockets. If damage is extensive, power will be out for 7 to 14 days.

Plan for an extended outage

If a major hurricane strikes North Florida, it's likely Clay Electric's distribution and transmission system will suffer heavy damage. It could take a week or more to restore service. Some outages will be longer.

Your plans should include preparing for a prolonged power outage. If a medical condition or other situation makes a prolonged outage a serious hardship, then you should have an alternate source of power available, like a portable generator. Relocation is another option.

Students experience the nation's capital

Clay Electric's Youth Tour to Washington contest winners enjoyed an activity-filled five days visiting the nation's capital.

When they arrived in Washington on June 10, the students joined a larger group from Florida to begin their tour of monuments, museums, legislative buildings and historic landmarks. They were accompanied by Todd Martin, member relations representative for the Gainesville District.

Students from 10 Florida electric cooperatives toured the Capitol, White House, National Cathedral, Smithsonian, Holocaust Museum, war memorials, and many other historic sites. Since 1964, the nation's electric co-ops have sponsored more than 40,000 high school juniors for visits to their U.S. congressional delegations, energy and grassroots government education sessions, and sightseeing in Washington, D.C.

This year's winners of Clay's Youth Tour to Washington trip contest are Brandon Ludwig of Keystone Heights HS; Andrew Griffis of Union County HS in Lake Butler; and Cole Tadrowski of P.K. Yonge DRS in Gainesville.

In notes turned in after the trip, all of the students expressed gratitude for being selected to go on the trip and said the entire experience provided them with many new experiences and learning opportunities.

"This was one of the best experiences of my life," Andrew Griffis wrote. "I have never been to D.C. before and this was an amazing experience!"

He added that he appreciated the architectural beauty and rich history of the capital, and was reminded of the cost of freedom and how precious liberty is. He said he was proud to be an American and a member of an amazing co-op.

Cole Tadrowski said he learned a tre-

mendous amount about U.S. history. "Touring the various memorials and museums gave me a new perspective on the events I was told about in my U.S. history class," he wrote. "Thank you for this incredible opportunity."

Brandon Ludwig said one of his favorite parts was having the opportunity to go in the viewing galleries of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

He said he also appreciated the chaperones for their hard work, which allowed all of the students from 10 Florida cooperatives to visit many places in D.C.

Martin said Clay's students were outstanding.

"The students were great," he said. "They were engaged in all the activities. The trip is fast-paced, and there is so much for them to see and learn about, but I think they really enjoyed their visit and the memories they made during the week."

What to do before, during and after a hurricane

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), has predicted an above average hurricane season this year.

“Preliminary forecasts point to an active hurricane season this year,” said Florida Commissioner of Agriculture Adam Putnam. “It’s crucial that Floridians plan early to protect their families and homes this hurricane season.”

While most Florida residents are familiar with the dangers each hurricane season brings, staying up-to-date on storm alerts and updating your safety plan each year will keep you one step ahead of the storm.

In particular, it is important to listen for key announcements regarding approaching storms. Different alerts and warning systems will help inform you how long you and your family have to prepare.

A hurricane watch, usually issued 48 hours in advance, notifies of possible winds reaching 74 miles-per-hour (mph) or higher. Similarly, a tropical storm watch calls for winds between 39 to 73 mph. Hurricane and tropical storm warnings, issued 36 hours in advance, notify of expected hurricane conditions and create more urgency to prepare your home in a shorter amount of time.

This unpredictable season requires months of planning, man-power, and preparation. Throughout the year, Clay Electric reviews its plan of action for before, during, and after the storm.

In the event of a hurricane or tropical system, here are tips you can use in order to prepare your home and family.

Before the Storm:

- Create an emergency supplies kit and family emergency communication plan.
- Discuss the plan with your family.
- Know your hurricane risk, including the approximate elevation level of your property and if the land is prone to flooding. This will help you prepare for a possible storm surge and any tidal flooding.
- Secure your home: cover all windows with either storm shutters or boards, clear loose and clogged rain gutters, and bring all outdoor furniture and plants indoors.
- Learn your community hurricane evacuation routes.

During the Storm:

- Listen to the radio or TV for information, if possible.
- Monitor your cell phone and/or email, as many communities have text or email

alerting systems for emergency notifications.

- Keep cell phone fully charged throughout the storm event, if possible.
- Turn off utilities if instructed to do so. Otherwise, keep the refrigerator thermostat on the coldest setting and keep the doors closed.

After the Storm:

- Keep away from loose or dangling power lines and report them immediately.
- Drive only if necessary and avoid flooded roads. Watch out for fallen objects, downed power lines, and weakened walls, bridges, or sidewalks.
- NEVER use a generator inside homes, garages, crawlspaces, sheds, or similar areas. Deadly levels of carbon monoxide can quickly build up in these areas.

\$10,000 College of Missionary Aviation

The College of Missionary Aviation exists to provide quality education and flight training to missionary pilot candidates. The College has served its area for a little over 2 years, and over the next 4 years is expected to have a \$5 million economic impact on the local community. Money from the grant is earmarked for the general scholarship fund.

\$6,700 Middleton-Burney Elementary School

Middleton-Burney Elementary School is located in Crescent City. Grant funds will be used to support C.A.M.P. Osprey, a 16-week program in which student leaders from the University of North Florida will serve as leadership mentors for fourth-grade boys.

\$10,000 Soldiers Freedom Outdoors

Soldiers Freedom Outdoors seeks to provide a safe, holistic place where military veterans can heal from post-traumatic stress disorder by engaging in outdoor activities. Funds from the grant will be used to expand the equine therapy program.

\$10,000 Fort King Heritage Association

The Fort King Heritage Association was formed to protect, preserve and develop the history of Fort King, a National Historic Landmark in Ocala that served as the headquarters for the Army of the South during the Second Seminole War (1837-42), and then Marion County's first courthouse and public building (1842-44). Grant funds will contribute to the building of a replica fort on the site.

\$5,100 Habitat for Humanity Columbia County

Habitat for Humanity assists low income and very low income families in obtaining decent and affordable housing by building homes using volunteer labor. Money from the

grant will be used to purchase an equipment trailer, tools and supplies.

\$15,000 George's Lake Area Volunteer Fire Department Station 16

George's Lake Area Volunteer Fire Department is a nonprofit volunteer community organization that responds to local emergencies. Its volunteers respond to medical and wildfire emergencies, assist with repairing storm damage, and monitor the well-being of senior citizens during major storms, as well as host a variety of community events. Grant funds will assist in repairing and re-roofing the station building, rehabilitating interior walls and bathrooms, and purchasing a new sign for the building and a 55" training monitor.

\$5,000 Salt Springs Civic Association

The Salt Springs Civic Association exists to promote the welfare and betterment of its community, and to maintain the Community Center and Civic Park. Money from the grant will go toward the construction of a new pavilion for Salt Springs Civic Park.
