Seminole Electric Cooperative provides wholesale power to Clay Electric and nine other electric cooperatives. Seminole operates a 1300-megawatt coal-fired plant near Palatka, a combined-cycle generating facility located in Hardee County, and 310 megawatts of peaking capacity.
